



## COVID-19 VACCINE SCREENING QUESTIONS

The following questions will be asked at the time of vaccination. Please review and be prepared to answer at that time.

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**Are you feeling sick today?** For moderate to severe illness, vaccination should be delayed until the illness has improved. Mild illness, or being on antibiotics, is NOT a contraindication.

**Have you ever received a dose of COVID-19 vaccine?** Brands of COVID-19 vaccine are not interchangeable.

**Have you ever had a severe allergic reaction (e.g., anaphylaxis) to something? For example, a reaction for which you were treated with epinephrine or EpiPen®, or for which you had to go to the hospital?** Individuals who have had severe allergic reactions to something, regardless of cause, should be observed for 30 minutes after vaccination. **Persons with a severe allergic reaction to an ingredient of the vaccine (see Fact Sheet) should NOT be vaccinated.**

**Have you received passive antibody therapy (monoclonal antibodies or convalescent plasma) as treatment for COVID-19?** If yes, vaccination should be deferred for at least 90 days.

**Have you received another vaccine in the last 14 days?** If yes, vaccination should be deferred for 14 days from the date of the last vaccine received.

**Have you had a positive test for COVID-19 or has a doctor ever told you that you had COVID-19?** If you have COVID, you should not be vaccinated until you have met the criteria to discontinue isolation.

**Do you have a weakened immune system caused by something such as HIV infection or cancer or do you take immunosuppressive drugs or therapies?** You can be vaccinated, but you should discuss any concerns with your physician prior to vaccination.

**Do you have a bleeding disorder or are you taking a blood thinner?** You can be vaccinated, but you should discuss any concerns with your physician prior to vaccination.

**Are you pregnant or breastfeeding?** You can be vaccinated, but you should discuss any concerns with your physician prior to vaccination.
