There was no public, board or staff comment.

Mr. Gross made a motion to approve the minutes of the Friday, March 18, 2022 Sandusky Co. Board of Health meeting as presented. Mr. Mason seconded the motion. Motion carried with all voting in the affirmative.

The financial report was reviewed with revenue for the month of \$839,229.69 and revenue year to date of \$1,330,609.81. Expenses for the month were \$225,438.72 and expenses year to date of \$673,561.03.

Mr. Mason made a motion, a recycler (landfill), consisting of three (3) properties owned by Diane, Gordon and Dan Keegan, be turned over to Ohio E.P.A. for remediation/clean up. Mr. Zimmerman seconded the motion. Motion carried with all voting in the affirmative. Sandusky Co. Commissioner Russ Zimmerman stated fire; Sheriff and EMA have been in discussion regarding the property, as two (2) major fires have occurred, with substantial runoff into nearby waterways. Material is disposed on the property with nothing being removed, therefore, a landfill situation rather than recycling. Dr. Vincent-Williams expressed gratitude to Director of Environmental Health Martha L. Bowen for working with Ohio E.P.A.

Director of Environmental Health Martha L. Bowen contacted Ohio Coastal Management regarding the Countyline Landfill.

Sandusky Co. Commissioners appointed Health Commissioner Bethany Brown to the OPIOID Fatality Review Board. The Board will meet two (2) times/year in closed session to review Opioid and suicide deaths in Sandusky Co. Other members include Sandusky Co. Public Health Medical Director Jennifer Greenslade-Hohman, M.D.; Sandusky Co. Coroner James Williams, M.D.; Mircea Handru, Director, Mental Health and Recovery Services of Sandusky, Seneca, Ottawa and Wyandot Counties; and Sandusky Co. Sheriff Chris Hilton's designee, Capt. Michael Meggitt.

Sandusky Co. Public Health is partnering with the City of Fremont for recognition as a City of Excellence. City of Fremont Director of Diversity and Inclusion Chari Mullen is the lead.

Sandusky Co. Public Health received \$54,894.96 in funds for 2021for Environmental Health Programs affected by the pandemic. In 2023, funds in the amount of \$18,664.29 will be received for a total of \$73,559.25.

A task force to develop protocols for remediation of public health nuisance, unsafe and unhealthy living conditions of dwellings in Sandusky Co. is formed. Task force members include: Director of Environmental Health Martha L. Bowen, Sandusky Co. Commissioner Russ Zimmerman; Sandusky Co. Board of Health members John W. Zimmerman and Dr. Regina Vincent-Williams, Sandusky Co. Prosecutor Beth Tischler and Township Zoning Inspectors.

An update on Terry Grunden/Betty Marty orders was given.
