The Ohio Dept. of Health Creating Healthy Communities offered additional funding and Sandusky Co. Public Health applied for \$25,000.00. The funds will be used for the inclusive park to be installed @ Rodger Young Park, Fremont, Ohio.

The annual Sandusky Co. District Advisory Council meeting was held. Nan Smith was re-appointed to a five (5) year term as the District Advisory Council's representative. Mr. Dean L. Auxter, City of Clyde, Board of Health representative, was re-appointed to a five (5) year term. Officers for the 2021 Sandusky Co. District Advisory Council are Matt Hofelich, Chairman and Robert Kusmer, Secretary.

03 - 12REPORT ON ANNUAL DAG MEETING

COVID vaccination clinics are being held, with appointment scheduling being done on the State of Ohio's UPDATE ON centralized system, gettheshot.coronavirus.ohio.gov. Public Health Nurses are able to upload client's information into the State of Ohio IMPACT system, as the questions on the vaccination form are given. Today's clinic of 150 was filled in less than 24 hours and beginning March 19, 2021, individuals 40 years old and older will be able to schedule an appointment. Mass COVID vaccination clinics are being held in Maumee and Cleveland, Ohio. Mr. Mason was informed that Whirlpool Corp. will received vaccine for their employees. On Friday, March 26, 2021, school personnel will receive the second dose of Moderna vaccine @ Terra State Community College. Terra State Community College has been a great partner in the use of the facilities for the mass clinics, as 640 doses of vaccine were administered in less than four (4) hours. At Sandusky Co. Public Health, three (3) days/week, childhood immunization clinics are held and two (2) days/week COVID vaccination clinics are held. Health Commissioner Bethany Brown thanked Probate Judge Brad Smith and Warren Brown for lending a nurse to assist in the vaccine clinics.

03 - 13COVID VACCINATI(CLINICS/ **CASES**

COVID cases and hospitalizations are trending down in Sandusky County. ProMedica, Bellevue and Community Health Services have reported a decrease in requests for testing. The City of Fremont wastewater testing is still revealing COVID present in the community.

The February, 2021 food service operation report was reviewed. Most violations were date marking/labeling of food products.

Division reports: Public Health Nursing is primarily dealing with the COVID vaccination clinics, contact tracing, and informing the public of any updates of the coronavirus.

03 - 15DIVISION REPORTS

Environmental Health Division currently has 110 properties in various stages of installation in the household sewage treatment system program.

Health Planning and Education Supervisor Charlotte Stonerook reported on available online trainings: March 25, 2021, PAX Tool Training and Everyone is An Asset Builder on April 8, 2021. The week of March 22-26, 2021 is National Drug and Alcohol Fact Week, with a poster contest for students in grades 9-12 on anti-vaping. The top three (3) winners will be a part of a digital media campaign. Students in 5th-8th grades may participate in positive activity/coping skills poster contest.

Health Commissioner Brown reported grant funding for current programs in Sandusky Co. Public Health UPDATE ON has not been received. The cost of one (1) clinic, held at Terra State Community College, cost the department \$9,000.00. Information on clinic cost has been sent to the Sandusky Co. Commissioners to CARES ACT review for future Cares Act Dollars.

Dr. Vincent-Williams reported training, sponsored by the NAACP, is being held in Toledo, on Saturday, March 27, 2021 to assist individuals in scheduling the COVID vaccination. Epidemiologist Ally Smith will reach out to Dr. Vincent-Williams to discuss partnering with community agencies/churches to schedule the African-American/Latino population.

Sandusky Co. Commissioner Scott E. Miller said concerns have been raised regarding Erie Agra gate quarry discharge water capacity being increased to 1.5 million gallons/day into Sugar Creek, Woodville, Ohio. Director of Environmental Health Martha L. Bowen stated that permit is under Ohio E.P.A. jurisdiction.

Commissioner Miller did state that \$11 million dollars has been earmarked in Cares Act funding for Sandusky Co. No information on when or if this amount will be received and stipulations.

Commissioner Miller stated James Williams, M.D., Ph.D., Sandusky County Coroner, is doing a phenomenal job.

Commissioner Miller stated, especially the east side of Sandusky County, there are several properties where buildings are vacant/dormant and in need of repair, demolish, or boarded up and what is the protocol to accomplish this. He will refer issues to Director of Environmental Health Martha L. Bowen.
